Important Information

1. There will be two additional seats for one girl child out of the only two girl children per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four. The additional seats will be given only for one girl child or one amongst the two girl children with no male child. The parents must submit an affidavit in the regards.
2. One additional seat each for student suffering from Cancer, Aids and Thalessemia. The parents must submit a certificate as a proof from National Institute like PGI, AIIMS etc.
3. Two additional seats for rural area students. The students must have studied in the rural school for at least five years before passing the last exam (Not in the area of Municipal committee or small town).
4. One additional seat for border area students over and above the sanctioned seats for various UG/PG course.
5. Free education to the children of persons killed in November 1984 riots and terrorist violence on Punjab.
6. Ten supernumerary seats are to be allocated for J & K students in UG Courses as per mail received from Education Officer, UGC dated 08-01-2019.

Admission Procedure and General Eligibility Conditions

Application for admission on the prescribed form should be submitted to the college office after the declaration of the result of the previous class and online submission of forms as per the schedule. No form will be accepted after the date specified. Incomplete forms will not be considered. Students should follow the following guidelines while filling up the admission forms.

1. The form must be filled up in the student's own handwriting.
2. Every candidate must write the name of her mother along with the name of the father in the stipulated column.
3. The spelling of the name of self, father and mother must be the same as recorded in the certificate/ D.M.C. of the matriculation/ previous examination passed.
4. Date of birth must be recorded properly with due proof. (i.e. the matriculation certificate)
5. If the Registration Number has been issued by P.U. Chandigarh, it must be filled in the stipulated column.
6. Affix two passport size photographs at the specified places and enclose one along with the form with your name, class to which admission is being sought.
7. Attested copies of the certificate/ Provisional certificate of the last examination passed/ DMC and Character certificate from the head of the institution last attended are required with the admission form.
8. For students belonging to the Scheduled Caste/Tribe or Backward Class, attested copy of the certificate issued by the competent authority to this effect is required.
9. Migration Certificate in case the candidate is coming from other universities Board/ Councils.
10. Admission is on the basis of merit. The college reserves the right to refuse admission to any applicant without giving any reason.
11. The applicants whose result is declared late may seek admission without late fee within ten days of the date on which the result is declared.
12. All admissions to the college are provisional and subject to approval by Panjab University, Chandigarh. The college shall not be responsible if the admission is not approved by the University and claims for refund of dues on any account, except securities, will not be entertained.
13. If a student is found ineligible at any stage her admission shall be cancelled and she will cease to remain a bonafide student of the college. Refund of any type except for the securities will not be admissible to her, as per the rules.
14. An affidavit in duplicate from each candidate having gap year seeking admission to the College/ Department to the effect that she was not disqualified by any Board/Body/ Council /University and she was not already registered with the Panjab University (wherever applicable), must be obtained by the concerned College/ Department before allowing admission.
15. That a candidate who has been placed under compartment/re-appear in one subject only at least 20% marks (Theory & Practical taken together) in the subject in which she has been placed in compartment in the +2 examination conducted by the Open School Board of India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st Semester of B.A./B.Com/B.C. A course under 10+2+3 system of education. She should have cleared the compartment before the declaration of the first year result. If she could not submit the relevant papers/documents on the date of declaration of result then her admission will be automatically cancelled.
16. The candidate who is admitted in first/third/ fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively. However, for promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fraction, like, 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered as 3, 4 or 5 respectively.

Admission Procedure and General Eligibility Conditions

17. The candidates coming from other Universities/ Boards/ Councils/ Bodies must bring with them, qualifying examination certificates, at the time of admission. Migration certificates should be submitted in the office. These certificates be verified from the result Gazette. If Gazette is not available then student should submit an affidavit to the effect that if the documents are not found correct her admission to the course will be liable to be cancelled.
18. For admission, fraction of marks less than requisite percentage would not be rounded off to the advantage of candidates, i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% shall not be rounded off to 33%, 40% and 50% etc.
19. It must be ensured that the examination passed by a candidate on the basis of which she is seeking admission to the next higher class in the Colleges ands recognized by the Panjab University.
20. The candidate who got admission in 1 st semester in a college and after completing the 1st semester could not get the admission in second semester due to one or other reason, should be given admission in second semester next year with the condition that the candidate must have attended the classes/ appeared in examinations in the college in the 1st semester. To overcome this problem, few admission dates for 2nd semester should also be allotted in January i.e. one week after the Winter Break as per P.U. Academic Calendar, 2025-26. (As per Syndicate Para 49 Dated 01-05-2016)
21. The Vice Chancellor has allowed to change a subject in any circumstances in the even semester examination whereas she will have to clear that subject as deficient in lower semesters examination which she has changed in the higher semester for qualifying the award of Bachelor's Degree (vide Circular No. Misc./A-6/3295 dated 06.04.2018)

MIGRATION RULES

1. Candidates from other colleges affiliated to the Panjab University can be migrated by seeking prior permission of the two Principals after obtaining a college leaving certificate from the previous college
- 2(a) A candidate who has passed her 1' semester and 2nd semester of B.A./B.Com./B.C.A Course conducted by another University/ College affiliated to another university in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to a college affiliated to this University/ Department of Evening Studies/ University School of Open Learning in the 3rd semester/5th semester of the respective course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV - 'Migration of Students' Page No. 289 to 304 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2016 on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subject/s if any, within the permissible chances. Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal/ Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to University (i.e. on the Registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University rule No. 6 given at page 302 of P.U. Cal. Vol-III, 2016.
- (b) For migration to this college from a college affiliated to other universities, a student should submit the following certificates along with the application form:
 - a. A migration certificate from the University concerned.
 - b. The lower examination passed certificate.
 3. Migration will not be permitted if the combination of subjects offered by the student does not tally with combination allowed in this college.
 4. Mid-term migration from any other university is not permitted.
 5. When the migration of a student has been allowed, she must join the college within 15 days, otherwise the migration shall be considered as cancelled.

Admission Procedure and General Eligibility Conditions

RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

1. A student who wishes to leave the college must apply in writing to the Principal and application must be countersigned by her father or guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until she has cleared her college dues.
2. A student has to pay the college fee and all other dues until her name is formally withdrawn.
3. Fee and other dues once paid shall not be refunded.

1. ADMISSION TO B.A./B.A. (HONS.)/B.A.(HONS.) WITH RESEARCH FOUR YEAR (EIGHT SEMESTER) UNDER NEP-2020

A candidate who has passed one of the following examination with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the 1st Semester of B.A./B.A.(Hons.) degree course of this University, however, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination, shall be eligible to join B.A./B.A.(Hons.) 1st Semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in **two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission**, failing which his/her admission to B.A.(Hons.) 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled.

- (i) B.A./B.A.(Hons.) Part I (Old Scheme)/Pre-Medical/Pre-Engg. Intermediate Arts/Science/Agriculture examination of Panjab University;
- (ii) the +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognised University/Board/Council;
- (iii) Prak / Shastri / Vishard examination with Compulsory English;
- (iv) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (i), (ii) or (iii) above.

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the

+2 examination conducted

by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A./B.A.(Hons.) Course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:-

- (i) He/she should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in **one consecutive chance** subsequent to the qualifying examination. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at one chance allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the qualifying examination, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

Provided that a candidate joining the B.A./B.A.(Hons.) First semester should have obtained at least 35% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practicals taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination.

NOTE:-The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.A. /B.A. (Hons.) 1st Semester, if they cleared their compartment subject/s in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/ is/s, are available.

2. ADMISSION TO BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (B.COM.)/ B.COM(HONS.) /B.COM.(HONS.) WITH RESEARCH FOUR YEAR (EIGHT SEMESTER) UNDER NEP-2020:-

Admission to the first semester of B.Com./B.Com. (Hons.) Degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council/University:

- (a) +2 examination or B.Com Part-I (old scheme) of Panjab University with three of the required subjects securing at least 45 per cent marks in the aggregate;
- (b) +2 Examination with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
- (c) +2 Examination who does not covered in(a) and (b) securing atleast 55%marks.

(d) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a) or (b) or (c) as given above with requisite percentage of marks given under each clause.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the first year of B.Com. (Hons.) should have passed in the subject of English at the +2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies /Councils/ Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after a candidate has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/ Council/ University in **two consecutive chances** subsequent to the admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him subsequent to the date of the admission, provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

Admission Procedure and General Eligibility Conditions

Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Year of B.Com./B.Com. (Hons.) Course, provided the candidate fulfills the following conditions:

- (i) Should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) Should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which the candidate had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in **one consecutive chance** subsequent to the qualifying examination. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at one chance allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the qualifying examination, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit. The merit for this purpose shall be determined on the basis of the score of a candidate to be computed as follows:

- (i) Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination;
- (ii) Add score of 2 for each of the subjects passed from the subjects referred in 8.1(a) not exceeding a score of 8 in total.

Explanation: In case of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed in Compartment.

NOTE: The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.Com. 1st Semester, if they cleared their compartment subject/s in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available.

3. ADMISSION TO B.C.A./B.C.A (HONS.)/B.C.A.(HONS.) WITH RESEARCHFOUR YEAR (EIGHT SEMESTER) UNDER NEP-2020:

A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible to join the First Year class of B.C.A./B.C.A (Hons.) course:

i.+2 examination in any discipline with at least 50% marks and passed Mathematics as one of the subject at Matriculation level;

OR

ii. Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (i) above shall be eligible to join B.C.A./B.C.A (Hons.) 1st Semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in **two consecutive chance in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, subsequent to his/her admission**, failing which his/her admission to B.C.A./B.C.A(Hons.) 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled.

iii. Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admissions shall be on merit.

Note: 5% weightage will be given for subject of Mathematics/ Statistics or equivalent to the candidate who studied the subject at 10+2 level at the time of admission in B.C.A./B.C.A (Hons.)



Admission Procedure and General Eligibility Conditions

B.VOC

Vocational courses are being run by college under National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) approved by University Grants Commission, New Delhi in the following streams:

- 1) Beauty and Aesthetics.
- 2) Food Processing and Preservation.
- 3) Fashion Designing.
- 4) Software Development.

These courses are offered to candidates having 10+2 from a recognized board/council in India in any stream. There is no age bar to take admission in these courses. These skill based programmes are offered at the level of certificate, diploma, advanced diploma, B.VOC. These courses offer multiple exit point to enable candidates to seek employment at any level.

P.G.D.C.A.

Admission to P.G.D.C.A.(Semester System):-

- I) Bachelor's degree of Panjab University under 10+2+3 system of examination with atleast 50% marks in any discipline. Or
- ii) B.E./B.Tech.Or
- iii) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (i) or (ii) above.

M.Com/M.A. English, Economics

Eligibility for admission

M.A PART I

A candidate who has passed any of the following examinations from Panjab University, or from any other university, whose examination has been recognized as equivalent to the corresponding examination

of the P.U. (Under 10+2+3 system of education) shall be eligible to join the first year (Part I) class of the M.A. course I The Admission will be strictly in order of merit. 2. For M.A., Graduation in any stream with at least 50% marks 3. For M.Com, Graduation in Commerce with at least 50% marks.

NOTE :

- I. A candidate for M.A. Part II examination must have passed M.A. Part I examination not more than three years previously.
- II. Following mode of testing and evaluation for Post Graduate classes has been approved.
 - a. Terminal evaluation 80%
 - b. Continuous Assessment 20%

Continuous Assessment may include written assignment, Snap Tests, participation in discussion in the class, Term papers, attendance etc.

CHANGE OF SUBJECTS

Students of B.A. First Semester are permitted to change their subjects within ten days from the commencement of classes.

- I. A student should select the combination of subjects carefully. No overwriting will be accepted.
- II. If the number of students offering a permissible combination is less than 10, the Principal reserves the right to ask the students to change the combination.
- III. Practical subject fee will not be adjusted or refunded in case of subject change.

NOTE:

1. The candidate securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part- I courses, if they cleared or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in

July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available (Syndicate para 43 (xiv) meeting held on 27-01-2013).

2. Eligibility from second semester onwards will be as per P.U. Rules.
3. For detailed information about the options of P.G. courses, contact the concerned Department.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility Conditions for University Examinations

- All the students are required to attend the classes regularly and punctually. They shall become eligible to appear in University examination only if they have attended the required number of lectures both in Theory and Practical classes. For University examination, a student is required to attend 75% of the delivered lectures.
- The students shall be awarded Internal Assessment on the basis of the Mid-semester tests. Any student who remains absent without the prior permission of the Principal shall be fined and shall be deemed to have scored zero in the subject (s) concerned. Any student found guilty of misconduct/using unfair means during the examination will be severely punished.
- A student appearing in the University examination shall have to secure at least 25% in the Mid-semester exams besides the requisite attendance in classes. End semester examination will be conducted by Panjab University, Chandigarh in 2025. Admission form of a student shall be sent for University Examination if she fulfills the eligibility conditions.

NOTE:

- Name of the irregular students will be struck off after continued absence. Proper leave application should be submitted in the office.

- Students who participate in Co-curricular activities like NCC, NSS, Youth Festival etc. should be given exemption for those days which are utilized for rehearsals and functions.

COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

- a) Each student is issued an identity card bearing her photograph, name and roll number. All the students are required to carry their identity cards with them during their presence in the campus. If the identity card is lost, duplicate card can be issued on payment of Rs. 50/- The identity card must be deposited back at the end of the academic session.
- b) Maintenance of academic atmosphere is expected from all.
- c) Students are not permitted to leave the college campus before 12.00 Hrs. Safety and security of the students outside the college campus is to be ensured by the parents.
- d) Moped/Scooter/Bicycles are to be parked at the stand. Defaulters will be fined.
- e) Vacant period should be spent in library.
- f) Visitors are allowed to meet their wards between 1200 hr to 1300 hr, only in urgency with the permission of the Principal.
- g) The college lays emphasis on the maintenance of discipline and proper decorum in and outside the class-rooms. Each student is expected to respect the rights of others, maintain the cleanliness and beauty of the physical surroundings and uphold the image of the college.
- h) Students must make it a habit to read the notices daily.
- i) Students are required to come to the college neatly and modestly dressed. Sleeveless & low necked, short tops, low waist jeans, half pants are strictly prohibited.
- j) Students should avoid making a noise in the classrooms, verandas and other places. Movements from one class room to another should be orderly, disciplined and dignified.

Admission Procedure and General Eligibility Conditions

Disciplinary action will be taken against those students found in the canteen or moving about while their classes are going on.

- k) Right of admission and entry to the college campus is reserved.
- l) A student who is guilty of misconduct in any way shall not be eligible for a prize, scholarship, fee concession, Sports Council or other important body in the college. Students found guilty will be heavily fined & can also be suspended/ expelled from the college.
- m) The name of the student absent for more than 7 days, without permission will be struck off from the college rolls.
- n) Any change in the address of the parents/ guardian must be reported to the college office without any loss of time. A student will be punished, rusticated or expelled from the college if she directly or indirectly takes part or induces others to do so in any activity in the college for any reason whatsoever, which in the opinion of the Principal is subversive of the college discipline.

LEAVE RULES

- a) Leave must be applied for in advance on the prescribed forms available in the office, duly countersigned by the father/guardian.
- b) Leave upto 3 days shall be granted by the tutor and for more than 3 days by the Principal. On days of special functions/ Celebration, leave will be granted by the Principal.
- c) In case of serious illness, the leave application must be submitted, at the earliest possible, along with the Medical Certificate by a competent medical authority.
- d) The maximum leave allowed to a student during an academic year will be for 15 days only. Extra leave shall be automatically cancelled and considered as absence.


LIBRARY RULES

- a) The college library has a valuable collection of books on topics of curriculum as well as general interest. It is open to all students.
- b) No student is permitted to enter the Library without the identity card.
- c) Two books are issued to a student for a period of 14 days only.
- d) The books can be re-issued for the specified period only if these are not in demand by other students.
- e) Reference books, text books, periodicals etc. shall not be issued except for consultation in the library premises.
- g) Books issued from the library should be kept very carefully and in no case shall pages be underlined or disfigured. If the book is already damaged in any form, it should be brought to the notice of the issuing clerk or the librarian at the time of issue; otherwise the responsibility will be of the student herself
- h) The loss of books should be reported to the Librarian before the due date otherwise the usual fine will be charged till the information is given. The borrower will be required to replace it, otherwise she will have to pay double the price of the books that cannot be replaced. Second hand books will not be accepted.
- i) The students are required to observe silence in the library and not to disturb others in any way.





The College Hostel




